Employees owe a duty to the Morrison-Talbott Library, its patrons, and Trustees to act in a way that will merit the continued trust and confidence of the public.

In general, the use of good judgment, based on high ethical principles, will guide you with respect to lines of acceptable conduct. If a situation arises where it is difficult to determine the proper course of action, the matter should be discussed openly with the Library Director for advice and consultation.

The Morrison-Talbott Library has adopted and abides by the Ethics Act Ordinance as required by Illinois law. Compliance with the Morrison-Talbott Library Ethics Act Ordinance is the responsibility of every Morrison-Talbott Library employee.
